## *Recovery by the Numbers*

*U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) as of Nov 2, 2018.*

- Deadline to register for the Blue Roof Program is **Nov. 11**.
- More than **2,052** Blue Roofs installed.
- **Seventy-one** generators currently installed, and **58** generators de-installed.
- Conducted **635** critical facilities assessments.

### *Shelters*

- Shelters have consolidated. Currently, **five** shelters are open with a population of **576** survivors.

### *Small Business Administration (SBA)*

- As of Nov. 2, more than **7,787** applications received with more than **\$84.7** million approved.

**NFIP**

- As of Nov. 2, more than **3,872** claims received; Paid more than **\$26** million: More than **1,149** claims closed.

**Individuals and Assistance Programs**

**Individuals & Households**

- More than **90,288** families and individuals have contacted FEMA for help and information.
- More than **\$90.6** million in grants approved, including **\$74.6** million in housing assistance, and **\$15.9** million of ONA. Total DRC visits **7,700**.
- Housing inspections issued: **58,560**; returned: **55,294**; outstanding: **3,266**.

**Rental Assistance**

- **15,705** homeowners and renters approved for rental assistance.
- FEMA is working closely with the state to provide other forms of temporary housing.

**Transitional Sheltering Assistance**

- TSA is in effect in Bay, Gulf and Jackson counties.

- HHS has launched the **Disaster Distress Helpline** is available to assist survivors coping with stress. To connect with a trained crisis counselor, call 800-985-5990 or text TalkWithUs to 66746 (for Spanish text Hablanos to 66746).
- HHS launched the **Emergency Prescription Assistance Program (EPAP)** for survivors who **do not have** health insurance. EPAP covers prescription drugs, vaccines and other medical supplies damaged in the hurricane.

- Florida launched a disaster-recovery portal where businesses can post and individuals can find **disaster-related job openings** at [disasterrecovery.employflorida.com](https://disasterrecovery.employflorida.com).
- Disaster Unemployment Assistance (DUA) is available to Florida businesses and residents whose employment or self-employment was lost or interrupted due to Hurricane Michael. Applications must be received by November 14<sup>th</sup>, 2018. DUA is available from weeks of unemployment beginning October 14, 2018 until April 13, 2019, as long as the individual's unemployment continues to be a result of the disaster.
