### **Statement of Issue:**

This agenda item requests Board approval of a Resolution to accept \$8,331 in additional funds from the Small County Outreach Paving (SCOP) Grant for the Live Oak Island Road project.

### **Background:**

On August 18, 2009, the Wakulla County Board of County Commissioners approved a Resolution to accept \$797,148 in grant funds for the resurfacing and widening of Live Oak Island Road.

In March of this year, Myra Suggs from the Department of Transportation contacted staff and offered an additional \$8,331 more in grant dollars if staff could provide a scope of services to use the funds toward. Staff responded that the additional funds would be used to install 280 LF of guardrail to the Live Oak Island Road project in order to protect drivers and environmentally sensitive areas.

### **Analysis:**

Along with the resurfacing and widening of Live Oak Island Road, the guardrails will provide a tremendous benefit to the community of Wakulla County. Staff is requesting approval of the additional funds for the allocation of guardrails at no cost to Wakulla County.

### **Options:**

1. Approve the Resolution to accept the additional SCOP funds of \$8,331 for the Live Oak Island Road Project.
2. Do not approve the Resolution to accept the additional SCOP funds of \$8331.
