INTRODUCTION

Wakulla County, Florida, is requesting sealed written proposals from vendors for the provision of junk removal services for the Code Enforcement Office of Wakulla County. The County will enter into negotiations with a maximum of 5 firms in order to establish a list of service providers who may provide services pursuant to the Junk Services Removal Agreement (the "Agreement"), incorporated herein. All proposals will be submitted to the Wakulla County Code Enforcement Board for review. The Code Enforcement Board shall rank the responding firms and recommend a short list to the Wakulla County Board of County Commissioners of those firms with which to enter into agreements. The terms of the Junk Removal Services Agreements shall be subject to the ultimate approval of the Board of County Commissioners. Specific projects shall be awarded on a project-by-project basis pursuant to a Request for Quotes submitted to all vendors with which the County enters into an Agreement.

Parties interested in preparing a response to this Request for Proposals must complete the requirements set forth in the attached documents. Under the proposal process of Wakulla County, the conditions set forth herein are binding on the proposer as confirmed by the signature of an officer on the cover letter.

Wakulla County welcomes your response. The County reserves the right to reject any response found to be non-responsive, vague, or non-conforming. The County also reserves the right at any time to withdraw all or part of this request in order to protect its best interests. The County is not liable for any costs incurred by the party in preparing its response, nor is a response an offer to contract with your firm. Pursuant to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, all responses are subject to Florida's public records laws.

MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

The Wakulla County Board of County Commissioners (BoCC) has established certain mandatory requirements which must be included as part of any response. The use of the terms “shall,” “must,” or “will” (except to indicate simple futurity) in this RFP indicates a mandatory requirement or condition. The words “should” or “may” in this RFP indicate desirable attributes or conditions, but are permissive in nature. Deviation from, or omission of, such a desirable feature will not by itself cause rejection of a response.

Responses which do not meet all material requirements of this request or which fail to provide all required information, documents, or materials such as request forms, bonds, etc., will be rejected as non-responsive. Material requirements of the bid are those set forth as mandatory, or without which an adequate analysis and comparison of replies is impossible, or those which affect the competitiveness of replies or the cost to the County. Respondents whose replies, past performance or current status do not reflect the capability, integrity or reliability to perform fully and in good faith the requirements of the contract may be rejected as non-responsive.

The Code Enforcement Board reserves the right to determine which replies meet the material requirements of the RFP and which Respondents are responsible and/or responsive. Further, the Code Enforcement Board or the County Commission may reject any and all proposals and seek new proposals when it is in the best interest of the County to do so.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO RESPONDENTS

2. Proposals must be typed. No changes in or corrections to proposals will be allowed after the proposals are opened.
3. All proposals shall include **ONE (1) ORIGINAL, SO IDENTIFIED AND EIGHT (8) COMPLETE COPIES**, in a **SEALED** envelope (or other packaging).
4. **BIDS MUST BE RECEIVED AT OR BEFORE THE TIME AND DATE** reflected on the timeline in the Calendar of Events of this RFP.
5. It is the Respondent's responsibility to ensure their proposal is delivered at the proper place and time as required in this RFP. **The official date and time of receipt is the date and time the proposal is stamped by the County.** Late replies will not be accepted.
6. Inquiries. Questions related to this RFP must be received in writing by the contact person listed below by the time indicated in the Calendar of Events. The questions may be sent US mail, courier, e-mail, fax, or hand-delivered to the sole point of contact, listed below. No telephone calls will be accepted. Inquiries submitted after the period specified in the Calendar of Events will not be addressed. 7. It is the responsibility of all potential Respondents to monitor this site for any changing information prior to submitting a response.

8. Respondents to this RFP or persons acting on their behalf may not contact, between the release of the solicitation and the County's posting the notice of intended award, any County employee, County Commissioner, or Code Enforcement Board member concerning any aspect of this solicitation, except in writing to the procurement officer as provided in the solicitation documents. Violation of this provision may be grounds for rejecting a response.

SCOPE OF WORK

The Wakulla County Code Enforcement Office and the Code Enforcement Board are seeking responses to this RFP for entry into Agreements with responsible and responsive vendors for the provision of junk removal services. Vendors are sought who are capable of providing professional cleanup services on private property as ordered by the Code Enforcement Board. Upon receipt of a Code Enforcement Board order requiring cleanup of private property in violation of a Wakulla County Ordinance, the Code Enforcement Officer shall send a Request for Quotes to each vendor with whom the County approves an Agreement. Such vendors shall then inspect the subject property and provide a written quote to the Code Enforcement Officer for removal, storage, if necessary, and disposal of the junk or other material. The lowest quote shall be awarded the individual project on a work authorization basis.

Vendors shall have the professional capacity to clean and/or remove junk and other materials including junked and abandoned vehicles, vessels, recreational vehicles, trash, household garbage, rubbish, mobile homes, construction materials, debris, metals, and appliances, or any of these items, as determined by the Code Enforcement Board, as well as cleanup from demolition projects and any other clean up or junk removal service for the Wakulla County Board of County Commissioner in conformance with the appropriate County, State, and Federal regulations. Furthermore, vendors would need the capacity to inventory, impound, and store any removed junk for a period of time up to fifteen (15) days, after which time the junk would need to be sold or disposed of in a manner consistent with the County's ordinance. Proceeds from the sale of junk shall be returned to the County and shall be used to pay all cleanup costs and administrative costs and fines imposed by the Code Enforcement Board which remain outstanding with any remainder being returned to the property owner.

Requirements for individual projects will be identified and set forth in the Request for Quotes.

Vendors with whom the County enters into an Agreement must exercise due care in entering private property and removing junk, and take all steps to protect landscaping, buildings and other structures located on the property being cleaned.

METHOD OF PAYMENT

Upon completion of the project and either the sale or disposal of all junk, the selected vendor shall submit an invoice to the Code Enforcement Officer which shall be submitted to the Director of the Wakulla County Office of Management and Budget for approval and payment.

REVIEW OF PROPOSALS, SELECTION OF VENDORS, AND AWARD OF PROJECTS

Respondents to this RFP who satisfy the required qualifications and are deemed to be responsive, responsible vendors shall be ranked by the Wakulla County Code Enforcement Board, which will serve as the evaluation team. In ranking proposals the Code Enforcement Board shall evaluate the proposals on the basis of the information provided by the Respondent, and rank each proposal for compliance with the qualifications of each Respondent and compliance with the mandatory requirements of the RFP. The rankings of the Code Enforcement Board shall then be submitted for approval by the Wakulla County Commission. Based on the rankings, the County Commission shall select up to five firms with which to enter into Junk Removal Services Agreements for the provision of junk removal services.

Individual junk removal projects shall be solicited on an as needed basis upon issuance of an order of the Code Enforcement Board requiring that the County clean a lot or parcel of property, in the form of a Request for Quotes submitted to all vendors with which the County has an Agreement. The Request for Quotes shall describe the nature of the project, the address of the project, and a deadline by which all quotes must be received for consideration by the Code Enforcement Officer.

Projects will be awarded by the Wakulla County Code Enforcement Officer after the deadline date and time, on an **all or none basis to the responsive, responsible vendor providing the lowest total overall cost and meeting the project time table included in the Request for Quotes**. In order to be deemed responsive, a vendor must have the ability to perform all requirements of the specific project. If the property must remain stored, the successful vendor must have demonstrated the ability to store the junk or other materials for the required period of time and sell it or dispose of it as required pursuant to section 27.073 of the County's Junk Ordinance. The final contract price will be the original response price, if an award is made.

Responses to this RFP that do not meet the requirements specified herein will be considered non-responsive or not responsible, as applicable. In the best interest of Wakulla County, the Code Enforcement Board reserves the right to reject any and all responses or waive any minor irregularity or technicality in responses received. Respondents are cautioned to make no assumptions unless their response has been deemed responsive. Furthermore, responses to Requests for Quotes for individual projects not meeting the requirements for such individual project will also be deemed non-responsive or not responsible, as applicable, and may be rejected by the Code Enforcement Officer.

A printed copy of the Response tabulation will be posted in the Purchasing Office and at the County's Administrative Offices and on the county's website (www.mywakulla.com). A copy will also be available upon written request to the Purchasing Office. Each written request must contain a self-addressed, stamped envelope and must reference the solicitation title and number.

QUALIFICATIONS

Vendors seeking to provide junk removal services must include the following information as a part of their response:

1. A list of all projects completed within the past two (2) years, including dates, clients, and approximate dollar value and size.
2. A list and copies of all professional certificates, permits, or licenses necessary to do business in Florida and in Wakulla County, including a valid, current business tax receipt issued by Wakulla County.
3. A list of all pending litigation and all litigation within the past five (5) years, including an explanation of each. Litigation initiated by the Respondent to protect the contractor's legal rights shall not be used as a basis for rejecting a response.
4. Proof or certificates of insurance confirming current worker's compensation, liability, and property damage insurance as required by law and the RFP, which list Wakulla County as an additional insured.
5. Audited financial information current within the past twelve (12) months, such as a balance sheet, statement of operations, and bonding capacity. The requirement for financial information may be satisfied by the Respondent providing written verification of the Respondent's bonding capacity or a surety bond.
6. The completed application and financial information shall be attested to and signed by an authorized officer of the company, the owner, or sole proprietor, as appropriate. The signature shall be notarized.
7. Three (3) references representative of related past experience to include, at a minimum, a contact person, company name, phone number, relationship to the vendor, and a brief description of the services provided to each reference (See Attachment #1).
8. The current work load and operating hours of the business.
9. A statement of all junk removal services the vendor is qualified to provide and a description of all junk removal equipment in the possession of the vendor.
10. The address of the location where the junk will remain stored, if necessary.
11. Provisions for identifying and properly disposing of hazardous wastes and potentially recyclable materials.

When responding to a Request for Quotes, vendors must submit the following additional information:

1. A quote for provision of the required junk removal services.
2. The earliest date on which such services may be provided.
3. A description of the manner in which all sellable items, if any, will be sold.
4. Payment Bond, as deemed necessary per quote.

EVALUATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

1. The proposals submitted in response to this request will be evaluated by a selection committee consisting of members of the Code Enforcement Board.
2. The selection of up to five (5) firms and the ultimate execution of contracts, while anticipated, are not guaranteed by the County. The County reserves the right to determine which proposals are in the County's best interest and award contracts on that basis, to reject any and all proposals, waive any irregularities of any proposal, negotiate with any potential offerer (after proposals are opened) if such is deemed in the best interest of the County.
3. The selection committee will evaluate the proposals that are responsive to the requirements of this RFP using the following criteria listed in order of importance:

4. All proposals will be reviewed and ranked according to competence and qualifications, and Respondents may be selected for interviews or oral presentations as may be necessary. The County makes no commitment to any Respondent to this RFP beyond consideration of the written response to this RFP.

5. The preceding criteria will be used to evaluate proposal responses and select the successful Respondent. The selection/evaluation team reserves the right to expand these criteria to include any other pertinent requirements as necessary or as directed by the Board of County Commissioners.
6. The proposals deemed best by the selection/evaluation team shall be presented by the County Administrator in the form of an Agenda Request to the Board of County Commissioners, who shall either accept or deny the recommendation of the selection/evaluation team as presented by the County Administrator.
7. The Board of County Commissioners, or its designee, shall negotiate a contract with up to five of the Respondents in accordance with Florida Statutes.

LOCAL PREFERENCE IN PURCHASING AND CONTRACTING

1. Preference in Request for Proposals. In the purchasing of, or letting of contracts for procurement of, personal property, materials, contractual services, and construction of improvements to real property or existing structures for which a request for proposals is developed with evaluation criteria, a local preference of the total score may be assigned for a local preference, as follows:
 - a. Individuals or firms which have a home office located within Wakulla, Leon, Gadsden or Jefferson County, and which meet all of the criteria for a local business as set forth in this article, shall be given a preference in the amount of 5 points.
 - b. Individuals or firms which do not have a home office located within Wakulla, Leon, Gadsden or Jefferson County, and which meet all of the criteria for a local business as set forth in this article, shall be given a preference in the amount of 3 points.
2. Local business definition: For purposes of this section, "local business" shall mean a business which:
 - a. Has had a fixed office or distribution point located in and having a street address within Wakulla, Leon, Gadsden or Jefferson County for at least six (6) months immediately prior to the issuance of the request for proposal by the County; and
 - b. Holds any business license required by Wakulla County; and
 - c. Is the principal offerer who is a single offeror; a business which is the prime contractor and not a subcontractor; or a partner or joint venture submitting an offer in conjunction with other businesses.
3. Certification: Any vendor claiming to be a local business as defined shall so certify in writing to the Purchasing Division. The certification shall provide all necessary information to meet the requirements of above. The Local Vendor Certification Form is enclosed. The purchasing agent shall not be required to verify the accuracy of any such certifications, and shall have the sole discretion to determine if a vendor meets the definition of a "local business".

EXECUTING THE JUNK REMOVAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

The construction, interpretation, and performance of this solicitation, and all transactions under it shall be governed by the laws of the State of Florida and Wakulla County. The Agreement shall include all terms and conditions of this solicitation, any addenda, response, and the County's contract issued as a result of this solicitation. Entry into an Agreement for Junk Removal Services does not guarantee that a vendor will be selected for any specific project. All contracts shall be non-exclusive.

AGREEMENT TERM

Agreements for the provision of junk removal services shall terminate two years after the date on which such agreements are executed, and may be renewed upon mutual agreement of the vendor and the County.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

SPECIAL ACCOMMODATIONS

Any person requiring special accommodations by the Board because of a disability should call the Board Purchasing Office at least five (5) working days prior to any pre-response conference, response opening, or meeting. RESPONDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY

It is understood and the Respondent hereby agrees to be solely responsible for obtaining all materials and determining the best methods that will be utilized to meet the intent of the specifications of this solicitation.

Any failure by the Respondent to acquaint themselves with the available information will not relieve them from responsibility for estimating properly the difficulty or cost of successfully performing the work.

Respondents are expected to examine the specifications and all instructions pertaining to the required commodities/services. Failure to do so will be at Respondent's risk.

ADDITIONAL LEGAL REQUIREMENT

All corporations seeking to do business with the County shall, at the time of submitting a response, be registered with the Department of State in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 607, Florida Statutes; similarly, partnerships seeking to do business with the County shall, at the time of submitting such response, have complied with the applicable provision of

APPEALS

A Respondent whose Response has been rejected by the Code Enforcement Board or the Wakulla County Commission shall be given the benefit of reconsideration and appeal as follows:

1. The Respondent may within ten (10) calendar days after receiving notification of such action, request reconsideration in writing. The Respondent may submit additional information at the time of appeal.

2. The Code Enforcement Board shall act upon the Respondent's request and issue a final decision within thirty (30) days after the filing and shall notify contractor of its action to adhere to, modify, or reverse its original action. The Board may require additional information to justify the reconsideration.

3. Final decisions of the Code Enforcement Board rejecting a Respondent for prequalification and inclusion on the approved vendor list may be appealed in writing to the Wakulla County Board of County Commissioners within 10 days of receiving notice from the Code Enforcement Officer of such final decision, for inclusion on the next available Board of County Commissioners agenda.

DRUG FREE WORKPLACE CERTIFICATION

Preference shall be given to businesses with drug-free workplace programs. - 4) In the statement specified in subsection (1), notify the employees that, as a condition of working on the commodities or contractual services that are under this solicitation, the employee will abide by the terms of the statement and will notify the employee of any conviction of, or plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, any violation of Chapter 893 or of any controlled substance law of the United States or any state, for a violation occurring in the work place no later than five (5) days after such conviction.
- 5) Impose a sanction, on, or require the satisfactory participation in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program if such is available in the employee's community, by any employee who is so convicted.
- 6) Make a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of this section.
